REPORT

OF THE

COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT

FOR THE YEAR 1870.

1. THE COMMITTEE have great pleasure in being enabled to present to the Members of the Institution a very satisfactory report of the proceedings of the past year, and of the present position of the Institution.

2. The general complaint throughout commercial circles of the depressed state of business of every kind during the year, makes the success of the Institution stand out the more prominently.

3. At the end of 1870 the number of members on the roll was 510, the largest number since 1864; the new members during the year amounted to 170, more than have joined in the same period since 1863.

4. The Institution is, also, for the first time in twelve years, out of debt; the balance of £20 4s. 2d., which appears in the statement appended hereto as a liability, being for two or three small accounts not yet rendered, and which can be met on presentation.

5. This result has not been obtained by any false economy; on the contrary, upwards of £30 have been expended in painting and certain additions to the building: an amount which will not be again required for some time. The front of the Institution not having been painted since 1862, its renovation had become a necessity.

6. An amount of £60 was voted for the improvement of the Library. The manner in which this has been expended has, we believe, obtained the approval of all the members; it has been

the means of transforming what was, in appearance, little better than a lumber-room for books, into a business-like and convenient library.

7. The supply of the reading-room and library has been the constant study of your Committee, and they trust that the new books and periodicals which have been provided have met with your approval. Many have been purchased in compliance with the wishes of individual members entered in the "Suggestion Book." The contract by Messrs. Dawson and Son, of London, has been carried out very satisfactorily, through their agent, Mr. Edward Whitehead, of Collins Street.

8. The out-going Committee recommend to the attention of their successors the desirability of improving the comfort and convenience of the reading-room; and the state of the finances being so favourable, this important matter will, doubtless, meet with their early consideration.

9. A table which has been compiled shows the great increase that has taken place of late years in the perusal of periodical literature, especially magazines. It will be observed that though there is but a small increase in the number of *volumes* circulated, the issue of *magazines* and other periodicals has increased twelve-fold since 1856, justifying the action of the Committee, who have paid special attention to this portion of the reading-room.

10. The following table will show the various fluctuations in the status of the Institution since 1856, and will no doubt be of interest to the members:—

16. There were also twenty-four meetings of Sub-Committees (Finance, Library, and House) during the year.

17. The Committee, before closing their report, desire to call on the members, individually and collectively, to make it their constant endeavour during the current year to obtain the accession of new members. If the advantages to be obtained by the outlay of the sovereign for a subscription are fairly set forth, any person who has time and opportunity to avail himself of them can hardly refuse to do so. From the mere fact of its early establishment (in 1839) the Institution is possessed of information and records superior to any other; and in no other library, public or proprietary, is there such a profuse supply of periodicals. After several years of depression the Institution has again made a step in advance; let it be our care that there shall be no possibility of a retrograde movement; this can most certainly be prevented by interest in its welfare being exercised by each individual member. By thus acting they will serve the Institution; it, in its turn, will be better able to serve them; the members they prevail upon to join will find that their friends have done them a service, and the report of 1871 will be found to show a gratifying advance on the present one for 1870.
